 More than 500 children receive high quality education normally available only to privileged families


- More than 300 children now bike to school, rather than walk, which minimizes school dropouts

Dental and Eye care. Intensive health care services is provided to 18 villages by the Health Centre benefiting more than 20,000. For conducting the screening with state of the art techniques. AASAI provided financial support to buy advanced Colposcopy-Digital equipment and financial support additional equipment and clinical services. AASAI Inaugurates Vocational Training for Women at Kalanjaim

Our dear friend and patron Mr. Dorairajan, (see picture above speaking), Chairman, kanzen Institute Asia-Pacific private Ltd, a management consulting firm, in Chennai, talked to Mr. Siddharth Agarwal, Owner of Silkasia Rajasthan and requested four sewing machines for kalanjiam. Mr. Agarwal spontaneously and generously contributed the machines and had them delivered to Kalanjaim. . This enabled us to obtain two more sewing machines from our dear friends, Mr. Gopalan Connecticut and Vaidyanathan, Bangalore Thanks to this generosity, on Feb 26, 2015, AASAI initiated its long awaited vocational training program at kalanjiam to train deserving women to acquire skills to earn independent living. Mr. Ezumali, a veteran tailor in the nearby village who has been associated with Kalanjiyam as a committee member for nearly 5 years will train the women to become tailors.. He along with another

supervising tailor manage the entire production and training. While on training ,AASAI provides Rs. 50 per day as stipend. At the end of this year, 24 women, selected on the basis of family need, would have acquired necessary skills to stitch ordinary items such as woman's blouses, skirts etc. Currently, the women as they get trained stitch bed sheets and pillow covers for Voluntary Health Services (VHS), a hospital in Chennai that provides medical care to the poor. The material is provided free to VHS as AA-SAI's contribution to VHS. In return,

VHS provides free medical care to all deserving poor from kalanjiam sponsored villages. Thus our

funding to Kalanjiam helps the women to become skilled and earn a livelihood, and at the same time helps VHS in its noble cause and also provides free medical care to Kalanjiam which is not ordinarily available to them. This model of self help, sharing of skills resources with other AASAI's projects will be cloned at Rehoboth and Shanitivanam both caring for mentally ill. Please join me to extend our sincere thanks to Mr. Agarawal,, Mr. Dorairajan, Mr. Gopalan and Mr. Vaidyanathan. May I request you to extend your support to this wonderful initiative.

A few years ago, we initiated a project with Kalanjiam, (a charity organization involved in rural development programs) to provide bi-cycles to poor students in rural village areas as a way to reduce school drop outs. AASAI has thus far provided nearly 300 bicycles. Commuting to school by

bicycles saves time, reduces physical strain and enhances energy level through physical exercise.




AASAI initiated general financial support to 'Siva Shantha Trust', a charitable Trust founded in 2002 by His Holiness Swami Shantananda. The Trust serves society through it's 'Temple of Service', 'Temple of

Fine Arts', and 'Temple of Knowledge'. The Temple of Service provides free medical care for the underprivileged through two outpatient clinics in Chennai and a consultation service in Tirukovilur (Villupuram dist), Tamil Nadu.

These clinics provide free consultation, medication, immunization and bear the cost of hospitalization when health care in a caring and conducive environment. Health camps are conducted to raise awareness of health is-

sues in the public and to provide an opportunity for early diagnosis and intervention. A milk program provides a source of additional nutrition to school children who live in the vicinity of the clinics (Chennai & Tirukovilur).

Encouraged by your support, AASAI has been involved with a wide range of activities, from children's education to care for abused women, from free health care to care for children afflicted with autism, and from women health center to vocational training and development of employment opportunities for women and other poor citizens. We are extremely thrilled of our success and diligently focused on improving these areas.

AASAI has been following a unique model of self sustainability of individual NGO and developing synergy through integration and sharing of skills and resources. (See page s 4 and 5). In addition our projects are environmentally friendly ensuring nothing goes to waste. For ex: at AASAI's Pudhumai Store, Rehoboth Home, donated used clothes are either sold to public or used by the residents. Remaining not wearable items are made into floor mats or mops and washed and provided free to VHS hospital in Chennai. Similarly, at Shantivanam, a mental health center, AASAI's Goshala, milk is either sold or consumed by the patients, cow dung is used at the biofuel plants generating cooking gas. The remaining waste is processed and sold as organic fertilizer and used in site vegetable garden, rice paddy, and grass feed for cows. These are but a few examples how your contributions are used effectively and efficiently. (see details in this news letter elsewhere)

Our annual fund collection is approximately \$70,000. Our goal is to raise \$100,000 a year. (We do not want to grow beyond that). We strive to find ways to raise the needed funds with certainty and with minimum efforts so we can focus our efforts on ensuring success of the projects rather than fund raising.

In order to reach the goal, we need you and other 99 donors to commit \$1,000 a year to AASAI. (If you have been contributing higher amounts, please continue. Considering several employers match your contributions, we need less than 100 people to rise \$100,000 year.) The simplest way to do this is to include AASAI as a payee through your bank's online bill pay and set up recurring monthly payments of \$83.33.
